



ECRA GREEN REINER RULES

- Rider does not have to be a member of NRHA or ECRA but must be an ECRA member to be eligible for year-end awards.
- Rider does not have to own the horse, however the horse owner must be an ECRA member in order for any money or points earned by the rider to be eligible for ECRA year-end awards.
- Any money and/or point earning by the rider are only eligible for ECRA year-end awards from the date of **rider and owner(s)** ECRA membership for the current point year. Money and/or point earnings are **not** eligible for ECRA year-end awards retroactively.
- Only one horse-one rider combinations are eligible for ECRA year-end awards. No exceptions will be permitted.
- Horse is not required to have an NRHA competition license.
- In order to be eligible for ECRA year-end awards, the horse and rider combination must have shown in at least 2 of the 3 ECRA shows within the point year. In the event that there are less or more than 3 ECRA shows, the horse and rider combination must compete in at least 50% of the ECRA shows offered within that point year in order to be eligible for ECRA year-end awards.
- Rider may show with one or two hands. Reins must remain in the same position as they are when the rider enters the show pen.
- Rider must complete full NRHA pattern (listed on show bill) as directed in NRHA rulebook.
- Rider is eligible for ECRA Green Reiner class until 25 points are earned, but may finish out the show season in the year he/her earns 25 points.
- Rider is not eligible for ECRA Green Reiner class if they have won over \$100.00 in any NRHA Green Reiner class prior to January 1st. Rider is not eligible if any money has been won in any NRHA Category 1 Ancillary class (for example: Rookie, Non-Pro, Novice, Open, etc.). If money is won after January 1st, the rider may remain in the ECRA Green Reiner class for the remainder of the current show season.
